
The book, called THE GIRLS OWN PAPER, has been lovingly covered and is in wonderful condition. The contents contained information on serious careers for girls, advice on style, beauty and dress, and short stories. There are also more serious articles for the more mature woman, perhaps whose husband or son has gone to war, or who had problems with anxiety.

The Girls Own Paper, which first appeared in 1880, and went through several name changes, finally ceased to exist in 1956. Mary Ann passed the book around and those who were interested were able to VERY CAREFULLY peruse some of the articles. Thank you for sharing Mary Ann.

#### **Our Visitor**

John Barnes our guest speaker, was the guest of David Wynne. They share Grandfather duties for the child of David's daughter Kirra and John's son Andrew.

John is visiting Wagga Wagga from Queensland where he is an Archdeacon in the Rockhampton Anglican Diocese. He has been in Queensland for the past two years, and talked a little bit about the vast space he travels in Central Queensland, and how tough the folk in that area are. He described his work as a 'Frontline Ministry'.



He was ordained at the age of 50yrs, and prior to moving to his work in Rockhampton, and the Sunshine Coast where he lives, he was an Archdeacon at the Goulburn and Southern Tablelands Parish for 8 years.

John started life as an Accountant, a profession he worked in for 10 years. He then completed a Masters Degree in Organisational Behaviour, and for the following 10yrs he worked in education as a business manager for a couple of schools. It was at that point he was called to his ministry undertaking a degree in Theological Studies. John very kindly shared his story with the club at very short notice, and we are all most appreciative of his generosity.
