Graeme Callander was absent so David Kennedy took on the role of sergeant-at-arms. He asserted his authority early in the meeting.

Presentation

Alan Lean's guest Neil Herriot is a member of the Rotary Club of Hope Island near Sanctuary Cove. His club has 50 members with approximately half the membership female. Neil presented a banner from the Hope Island club to our president David Payne.





Guest Speaker

Terry Mecham introduced the guest speaker, our very own **David Friedlieb.** We were privileged to have David, as Richmond was playing St Kilda. They managed quite well without his support. David is a member of the Wollundry Too Art Collective. Six couples or 12 people formed the group in 2013 with the intention of running it for 10 years. There are currently 14 members. The principal objective of the group is to



acquire and share art works. This would hopefully lead to better knowledge about the world of art. The collective started with \$12,000 and with money contributed over the years about 23 works have been acquired, mainly paintings but also two sculptures and some photos and etchings. They are shared among the 9 households involved and rotated every 3 months. Works of art are acquired by an internal buying committee of 3. Each member holds office for one year and they follow guidelines set by the group. It was agreed that there should be a defined theme for the collection. Initially the theme was to focus on emerging Australian artists. Another practical requirement was that paintings must fit in a car, for ease of sharing. The initial intention was to purchase a greater number of less expensive works and then look for more significant items.

David mentioned that difficulties may emerge in such a group with agreeing on a defined theme and overcoming a tendency for the committee members to act as individuals rather than as a group. The group has been a success. Members are much more knowledgeable about art, and have enjoyed the social interaction which has developed. They have been able to sponsor year 12 art students, as well as Wagga Art Gallery prizes. An exhibition of the group's paintings was recently held at the Curious Rabbit café. With 2 years to run, decisions need to be made about the future of the collection. Should it be dispersed, or maybe the group reconstituted and run for another 10 years. Serious consideration is being given to all options.

Peter Olson moved a vote of thanks to David for a very informative talk. The meeting concluded with the singing of the National Anthem.
