

FROM OUR PAST – Rotary Club of Wagga Wagga 90th Jubilee 1930 – 2020



A significant occasion for the new club was a visit from Rotary Founder Paul Harris.as part of a trip Harris made to South East Asia & Australia with his wife in

1935. In just thirty years since its founding, Rotary had grown into an international organisation with more than 3700 clubs in .80 countries and a membership of over 150,000 members and Harris as President



Emeritus made the trip as a Rotary Ambassador to help disseminate the Rotary message. He also made trips to Central & South America as well as Europe & South Africa.

So there must have been a Wow factor when in March, 1935 the young Rotary Club of Wagga was selected to host a meeting for a visit by the Harris' who called in on their journey from Sydney to Melbourne. On that occasion they were accompanied by Angus Mitchell, of the Rotary Club of Melbourne, who became World President of Rotary International 1948-49. *The Daily Advertiser reported the meeting on Monday 1st April* 1935:-

'Yesterday at the Commercial Hotel the members' of the Wagga Club and their wives spent a couple of very happy hours with Mr. and Mrs. Paul Harris, Mr. and Mrs. Angus Mitchell;,Mr. and Mrs. Dan Hellings, and Mr. and Mrs. G. Shaw (all of the Melbourne



Club). The president of the Wagga Club (Rotarian L. S. Castles) was in the chair. Amongst the invited guests were the Mayor (Alderman McDonough) and Mrs. McDonough, Mr. J C. Sheekey (President of Legacy) and Mrs. Sheekey, Mr.Allan Edwards (president of the Apex Club)' and Mrs, Edwards, and Mr. C R. Macdonald (town clerk)'.

'Rotarian H. E. Mitchelmore, foundation president of the Wagga Club, supplemented the words of welcome to Mr. Paul Harris and Mrs.. Harris and the other visitors. He paid a tribute to the work of Mr. Paul Harris, who had lived to see the. consummation of his ideal of bringing men together in a. spirit of better understanding and goodwill.'

'When Rotarian Paul Harris rose to address the gathering there was no doubt as to the warmth of the welcome from Wagga Rotariams. He thanked them for so kindly receiving him and his wife and said that their welcome was typical of what had been occurring everywhere he had been in this fine country. He said that a great necessity of our times was the removal of misunderstandings. It was by men. coming together— especially those of different countries— that a better appreciation could be formed of the other persons' views. Any movement that made for better understanding was surely worthwhile.'.

After the meeting the visitors were taken to several local vantage points and left for Canberra the following morning.

DEATH OF SIR CLEM RENOUF, Rotary International President 1978-79

Sir Clem Renouf, the 1978-79 Rotary International President who helped propel Rotary toward its top goal of eradicating polio worldwide, has died on 11th June, at age 99. He was a member of the Rotary Club of Nambour, Queensland, Australia, for 70 years. He served as RI director, Foundation trustee, district governor, RI committee member and chair, and International Assembly discussion leader.



In early 1979, on a flight home from the Philippines, Renouf read a magazine story about the eradication of small-pox. He wondered if Rotary's new Health, Hunger and Humanities (3-H) Grants could be used to eliminate another disease. They, for the first time, allowed Rotary projects to be taken on by more than just one club or district. Renouf consulted with a friend, John Sever, who was a district governor in Maryland, USA, and chief of infectious diseases at the United States National Institutes of Health. Sever happened to be friends with Jonas Salk and Albert Sabin, who developed polio vaccines in the 1950s and 1960s. After doing some research, Sever said that polio would be the best disease for Rotary to work on.

"Clem then set his sights on polio eradication as a Rotary worldwide project," wrote Ray Klinginsmith, 2010-11 Rotary International president, in a tribute to Renouf. In November 1979, the RI Board agreed to

set the eradication of polio as a primary goal of the 3-H program.

In 1985, Rotary launched the PolioPlus program, and it later spearheaded the Global Polio Eradication Initiative with its partners — national governments, the World Health Organization, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNICEF. The GPEI continues to pursue worldwide eradication of polio.
