## NO MEETING ON THURSDAY

## WORLD POLIO DAY 24<sup>TH</sup> October 2019

Rotary and its partners in the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u> (GPEI) are celebrating a major milestone this World Polio Day: confirmation that a second type of the wild poliovirus has been eradicated - a significant step toward the ultimate goal of a polio-free world.<u>Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus</u>, director-general of the World Health Organization (WHO), announced the historic feat in a video address during Rotary's Global Online Update on 24 October.

He said an independent commission of health experts certified the global eradication of the type 3 strain, which hasn't been detected anywhere in the world since Nigeria identified a case of polio that it caused in November 2012. The type 2 strain was certified as eradicated in 2015. "That leaves just wild poliovirus type 1," Tedros said. He also commended Rotary's long fight against polio. "Everything you [Rotary] have done has brought us to the brink of a polio-free world."

Tedros balanced the good news with a note of caution, saying that the biggest enemy of global eradication is complacency. He encouraged Rotary members to redouble their efforts. "We must stay the course. Together, we can make sure the children of the future only learn about polio in history books." If we stopped now, the virus would resurge and



could once again cause more than 200,000 new cases every year," said Tedros. "We must stay the course. Together, we can make sure the children of the future only learn about polio in history books."
