SPECIAL REPORT – HOWARD MENDEL'S WATER PROJECT

Last week, we listened to a 'Short & Sweet' presentation by Bryan Short. To refresh your memory, Bryan provided an update on Howard Mendel's activities in developing a water pumping and filtration system to benefit communities that cannot enjoy the safe, potable water that we take for granted.

Howard is a semi-retired engineer with extensive experience in pumping and filtration systems. Following a successful career in Melbourne, he relocated to Wagga for family reasons and joined Wagga Rotary Club. Howard has designed a cost-effective plant that can be used to provide potable water for Australian remote indigenous settlements as well as 'third-world' communities.

The system was originally tested in Graham Russell's dam and is now 'up and running' at the indigenous settlement of Dhupuwamirri, in Arnhem Land (NT). If you are not familiar with Dhupuwamirri, it is not surprising – as it is a couple of hundred kilometres from anywhere else with which you are probably not familiar. The settlement is on a billabong where running water in the wet season is reasonably safe – however, in the dry season the population of infectious microorganisms grows exponentially. The absence of potable water during the dry season is having a



marked effect on the inhabitants, especially the children. Water processed through Howard's plant should ensure that they can celebrate more birthdays, and stay healthier for longer.



The module is installed below an elevated water tank that is filled by an electric, submersible pump through the line (see picture). Raw water in the elevated tank provides pressure to the module for filtering and also for charging the red pressure tank to back-flush the filter. This arrangement removes the need for a filter pump.

A similar system is currently under consideration for Tutuala (Timor Leste) where our Rotary Club was instrumental in the construction of a Pre-School building a few years ago. The only difference being that the

tower will not be required as there are natural hills in Timor Leste. Subsequently, Howard intends to expand further into PNG and Nepal through his Rotary and other contacts.

Howard is currently in discussions with Engineers Without Borders, Australia, an organisation that has extensive representation throughout the 'third world'. The objective is to seek their input and assistance, initially in Timor Leste. It is highly desirable to have engineering support in the relevant regions.

In commissioning the Dhupuwamirri project, Howard has expressed his appreciation for support received from: -

The Laynhapuy Homelands Aboriginal Corporation (Nhulunby, NT),

Consulting engineer, Geoff Harris who supervised the project,

The Rotary organisation mainly in Wagga Wagga and Perth, Geoff Barker (Architect) and

Ron Crouch Transport (Wagga) and their contact company based in Sydney.
