MEETING REPORT: -

Attendance.

President David welcomed all to the meeting with a special welcome to our Key-Note Speaker, Brazilian exchange student, Sofi Seneme (who arrived in Wagga early this year) and John Heazlewood's guest, Ben Howard who had been a Rotary Exchange student to Brazil in 1995. There were 32 members present and a warm welcome was extended to our returning members Allan Duffus, Paul Galloway & Alok Sharma. There were 11 apologies.

President David spoke briefly of the sad loss of Barry Francis and requested all to stand and observe one minute's silence in his memory.

Vale Barry (Bazza) Francis.



Tony Hutchinson was asked to reflect on Barry's life. His comments are recorded in full below.

"On Sunday at approximately 1.30 PM Barry Francis lost his long running battle with his heart and passed away at the WWBH ICU.

He was born and schooled in Queensland. He learnt music and singing as a child and developed that talent over the years. He was a surfer and a keen rugby player. He met and married Chris and they have two children and two grandchildren.

He trained as a boilermaker/welder, worked in PNG and Bougainvillea but his claim to fame was he was involved in building the frame of the main stage at the Sydney Opera House. His other

jobs included working cruise ships as an entertainer and playing a part in the Dirty Dicks musical theatre restaurant. He joined the RAAF and trained as a ground radio technician serving at Springwood, Amberley, Melbourne and eventually was posted to Wagga with the RAAF School of Radio. He left the RAAF in the early 1990's and worked for TAFE at the RAAF School of Technical Training as an electronics and radio communications instructor. In 1998 he suffered a massive heart attack and was told he would never work again. Plenty of support and a dogged determination saw him return to being an instructor and he did not retire until 2013 when TAFE lost the contract.

I met Bazza in 2000 when I started working for TAFE, also as an avionics instructor. We became good friends and I encouraged Bazza to pick up the guitar again by getting him to entertain us at some of our garage parties. I introduced him into Rotary in 2005 and he really enjoyed the atmosphere, company and being on the BBQ team. He was elected to the board and was president in 2011-12. He received a PHF in 2012 and a Sapphire Pin in 2016.

His love of music led him to the Wagga Male Rugby Choir where he found more like-minded people. He also started busking down town at the weekends and raised \$17,000 for local charities. In 2010 his friends chipped in for his birthday and bought him a recording session at Flying Fox Studios where he produced a CD called 'Songs of the Street'. Nearly all the copies have been sold and he was contemplating either a re-release or producing another album..

He has been plagued with health issues, especially over the last 10 years, but he continued to press on with medical science coming to the rescue with two pacemakers and regular interventions plus a briefcase full of pills to keep everything working. Unfortunately another heart attack did too much damage and combined with kidney failure and blood problems there was no recovery.

Please stand and raise your glasses in a toast to the memory of our good mate and fellow Rotarian Bazza"

Peter Murray reflected on a time when he was secretary of the Gundagai Rugby League Football Club and in particular about one semifinal match that ended in controversy. Fines Session.



Paul Galloway, with some help from Alok Sharma, commented on various topics. He started with an emphasis on Exchange students and compared the similarity between the Australian and Brazilian national colours. He mentioned an American student who lived exclusively on peanut butter sandwiches. Paul then noted the political colours of the USA – it is all blue and red but no green. There was a story of motor bikes, fences and wombats that some members seemed to relate to. I am not sure where the fines were in these stories but the coins kept rattling the boxes.

Finally Paul talked of the money that Barry had been able to raise with his singing and asked us to sit and reflect on Barry's music and donate accordingly.

Key-Note Speaker.

Brad Bland introduced our guest speaker Sofi Seneme who is in Australia as a Rotary Exchange student. As a fifteen year old Sofi had contact with Australian exchange students who were living in Brazil. She made the decision to become involved in the Rotary Exchange programme. Australia is a long way from home and her family, so she said she was a little afraid. This was not helped by stories of dangerous Australian animals especially sharks - or that students rode kangaroos to school.....

Sofi is very proud of her home city of Rio Claro with a population of more than 200,000. There is an Australian connection through the Museu do Eucalipto which was established in 1916. It has a very large collection of eucalyptus.

Sofi's time in Australia has been disrupted somewhat by Covid



19. There was a trip planned to central Australia in March which was cancelled. This was a great disappointment. However there were many other activities in compensation. Visits have been made to Sydney, Tathra, Ulladulla, Nynghan and to Hay where she helped shear a sheep, a real highlight. Sadly there was no trip to Melbourne.

Sofi has been attending Wagga High School during her time in Wagga. Initially she found Australian English very hard to understand but she has enjoyed her time at Wagga High. Because Brazilians have their main meal at midday school times are different to Australia's school hours. Sofi also noted that there are no elective subjects in Brazil's schools so when she is home she has her dance classes outside school hours.

When asked if she would like to return to Australia Sofi mentioned the expense but yes she has many friends here. However she still has her last year at school in Brazil to complete.

Garry Roberts thanked Sofi for her summary of life in Brazil and her experiences as an exchange student in Australia. She was presented with a certificate confirming our commitment to vaccinate ten children against polio.

Ben Howard spoke briefly and thanked the club for the invitation to attend tonight's meeting. As a former exchange student he commended Sofi for her courage in coming to Australia where the language is different and in a year when where society has been so disrupted by Covid 19.


