President David announced that: -

- A board Meeting is to be held at 8:00 PM following the dinner meeting.
- The club intended to go cashless tonight but this was postponed to next meeting. Nepal has organised the hardware- the software will follow.
- The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has announced its intention to extend its sponsorship of Polio-Plus – \$2 for every \$1 raised – to be capped at \$US150 million.
- The Membership Seminar proposed to be held at Young on the 8/ 9th March has been **CANCELLED**.
- A volunteer is still required to join the combined Wagga Rotary Clubs sub-committee considering the

Short & Sweet.

Short and Sweet was introduced by Philip Cross who has been researching our Club history. He recently



discovered some Bulletins from 1990/91, when Graham Russell was Club President. A segment titled "**How Well Do You Know Me?**" was published in the Bulletin each week – all members of that era participated. Apology Procedure - A Reiteration.

Book Fair Preparation - Help Needed.

Never let us forget that the Annual Book Fair is one of the few, and in some years, the only, major fund-raising event in our Club Calendar! From the proceeds of this event, we support most of our charitable activities.



Each year, all members 'rally to the cause' in the first week of May; but we are also vaguely aware that there is hive of activity occurring, behind the scene, for most other weeks of the year. There is the weekly (Tuesday) Book Sorting plus regular collection and transportation of book stock (from the local Salvo's, Elders and similar facilities – as well as occasional requests from donors for collection from their respective establishments). The collection/transport of stock was specifically addressed at our most recent meeting.

A 'hand-full' of dedicated members have been collecting and transporting stock to our Copland Street warehouse for some years now. The job is becoming a bit onerous for this dedicated few and some assistance



is required. Unfortunately it is traditional that collections normally occur during working hours, as this fits in well with Elders (who graciously act as a receiving depot for donated books etc). These hours might preclude some members from offering their assistance as they have unavoidable work or other commitments. Are there any other members available to put in a few hours on this task? We are not seeking an enduring involvement but rather just to spread the load over a broader membership base.

To help achieve this, Lyndal Seymour has agreed to prepare a Club Roster – some names for the roster were taken at the meeting and any other members who might be available to
