Gordon Saggers entertained us all with a string of yarns and jokes for which Club members were only too happy to consign their coinage to the fines box.

Key-Note Speaker.

Graham Russell capably introduced Janine Mc Beath, our Key-Note speaker for the evening.



Janine began by providing an insight into how all of her life experiences had led her to her current 'career'. Admitting that school 'wasn't for me', detailing her various jobs that all seemed to be at the same location, and making the transition to 'private employment agencies' after the demise of the CES were all important parts of her journey. She undertook a psychology degree as a mature age student, and continued to assist people in finding employment. The diagnosis of one of her grandchildren with mild autism at age 3 motivated her to find out everything she could about how to help people with disabilities lead their 'best life'. And this has

led to her being fully immersed in her current 'career'.

Janine's official title is 'Job Coach' with the NSW Dept of Education. What she does is work closely with students with all levels of disability (from mild to severe) to ensure that their vocational needs are met. Simply put, she works hard to prepare disabled students from years 9 to 12 for life in the workforce. 'Project Workskills' is a 9 week program usually run for Year 9 students in which Janine introduces students to the skills needed to get and keep a job. This is followed by 'work placements' for students in years 10 to 12. Janine's students come from Willan's Hill School, and the Support Units at Kooringal and Wagga Wagga High Schools.

She not only spends time preparing the students for work placements, but also works closely with employers who are willing to host the students for a placement. Her praise for the Wagga community and local businesses was abundant. Without the support and cooperation of employers, this program would fall flat. Her wish for each of her students is that they 'have a role and feel valued'. Her students are indeed fortunate that Janine is so passionate about what she does!

FEBRUARY IS ROTARY PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION MONTH: -



Rotary International invite us to reflect upon Peace & Conflict Resolution during the month of February. Globally, conflict is reported to have affected some 68 million people in the past year, with at least half of those being children. We must refuse to accept conflict as a way of life.

Rotary projects provide training that fosters understanding and provides communities with the skills to resolve conflicts. Instances of these will be summarised in subsequent issues of this Bulletin during the month of February.

On the local scene, the month culminates with the **Wagga Peace Ceremony** as detailed on page two above. This ceremony is the recognition of Wagga Wagga becoming the first declared International Peace City, an idea that was conceived in Wagga Wagga, in 1993 by Kooringal Rotarian Tony Quinlivan. The local Community Peace Monument was unveiled in the Victory Memorial Gardens precinct by PRIP Royce Abbey and the local Mayor of the day, Ald Pat Brassil. Subsequently, fifty-eight Peace Communities have been proclaimed in 17 countries around the globe.
