Administration Matters.

President David began with the Invocation followed by a toast to Rotary Australia and all those impacted by the Corona Virus. The following administration were discussed: -

- ◆ The Wagga Rotary Presidents met last Tuesday and David summarised the matters discussed:-
 - 1. **A new Coordinator for RYDA** is being sought as Max Chapman has announced his retirement. RYDA is being held this year, at the Wagga Show Ground, from the 17th to the 20th March.
 - 2. **Driver Simulator Group** we are awaiting the outcome; expected by June.
 - 3. Real Schoolies Five Wagga students have expressed interest in being part of this program.
 - 4. **Dream Cricket:** Murray Patterson and Mary Brell from Orange gave a presentation and they are keen to revive this program. Rotary Club of South Wagga will co-ordinate the program this year.
 - 5. Wollundry Club have an exchange student, Sofie from Brazil
 - 6. **A Video**, promoting the various activities of the Wagga based Clubs is being produced.

Key-Note Speaker.

Mary Ann introduced Margaret Perkin, our guest speaker. As stated above, Margaret is a Past President of the Coolamon Rotary Club and had travelled to India with Wagga Rotarians, including Mary Ann, on one of the Darkness to Light trips.



Margaret's more recent travels are to Cambodia, with the Help Cambodia Team (HCT) and she presented a very informative Power Point which illustrated HCT's main activities including the Education Centre, Literacy, Equivaling, English, Traditional Dance Kindergarten and Family Support. However, the main goal of the trip was to assist students with English as a second language.

The HCT has raised \$28,000 to assist with the building of the Education Centre which now caters for 200 preschoolers.

One of Margaret's favoured activities was the planting of seedlings. HCT had taken Woolworth's seed boxes so that the children could observe the growth of the plants and then enjoy the vegetables that they produced. HCT also took suitcases full of school supplies including some books selected from our Book Fair donations.

The children displayed a great love for old fashioned ball games such as Tunnel Ball and Captain Ball and further donations of ball is planned. They also enjoy colouring in.

She informed us that the funds that Wagga Rotary Club donated were used mainly to buy back packs for the children. They were very much appreciated.

Margaret also informed us that the Wagga branch of HCT is holding a fund-raising Movie Premier Night in early April. The movie will be the new James Bond Film. We will be informed of the details so that we can provide still further support for this worthwhile project.

Philip Cross thanked Margaret on our behalf and presented her with a certificate confirming that we will immunise 10 children against polio in gratitude for her presentation.

INSURANCE: -

FEBRUARY IS ROTARY PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION MONTH: -

Continuing on with the Rotary Monthly theme, this week we review the story of the Key-Note Speaker at the 2016 Rotary International Convention (South Korea).

Rosemary Anne (Rosie) Batty AO, became a domestic violence campaigner in 2014 following an unfortunate incident where her 11-year-old son, Luke, was murdered by his father. Rosie had endured an 'on again-off again' abusive relationship, since 1992 with Greg Anderson. The relationship culminated with him murdering their son in Melbourne, at cricket practice, in February 2014. Anderson died as a result of self-inflicted knife wounds and police gunfire later that day.



Rosie has spoken about a lack of communication

between services, about public perceptions of domestic violence, about a lack of funding, and about police and legal procedures that she felt disempowered her ability to protect herself and her son. She established the Luke Batty Foundation to assist women and children affected by domestic violence.

For her efforts, Rosie was awarded the Pride of Australia's National Courage Medal and the 2015 Australian of the Year.
