- This Sunday (23rd Feb) at the Riverina Playhouse, the Rotary Peace Awards will be held at 11.00 am. As many members as possible to attend.
- o **Struggle Street Family Nangus.** Ellen reported that she and Elaine (along with members of the Merimbula Club and other local Clubs) inspected the conditions that this family are living under and were shocked. Four are sleeping in one room and the roof leaks badly. Thus the roof will be the first to receive attention. This is a project coordinated by the Merimbula Rotary Club and they have called on our Wagga Club to supply about 6 volunteers who are prepared to help when needed. You don't have to be a "Tradie". Bushfire Statistics:

These statistics reflect the impact in our 'immediate' area.... incorporating Tumbarumba, Batlow, Adelong and smaller centres.

- a. 182 houses destroyed
- b. 44 houses damaged
- c. 46 Government facilities destroyed
- d. 587 Out-buildings destroyed
- e. 741 Rural landholders impacted
- f. 402,650 hectares of farmland destroyed
- g. A similar area of National Park and Forestry destroyed.

Other Comments.

- o All people who have been impacted have to put in coroner's report
- Legal Aid is very keen to support anyone when the insurance company won't play ball.
- o The renewal of fencing with Government agencies is a huge issue.
- o The removal of timber inside the boundaries of National Parks and Forestry is a huge issue also. For future fireproofing and fire control,50 metres (minimum) needs to be removed.
- This recovery may take years people need support, especially the older people who have had a lifetime of work wiped out.
