Graeme Callander introduced our guest speaker Sally Bryant, with a warning that we should not linger over our questions at the end of her presentation as Sally needed to 'nick off quickly', because she gets up early every morning to do her radio show on ABC Radio Riverina. (Actually it's not early in the morning, it's still the middle of the night!)

Prior to moving to Wagga late last year, Sally had been Rural Reporter based in Dubbo for 6 years, largely reporting on the drought.



Moving to Wagga was a huge change, which she has enthusiastically embraced. As she stated, the multicultural events, The Arts, all the opportunities in Wagga, just blew her away, and she really loves working in Wagga. Then, The Bushfires Hit. First Drought, then Bushfire.

At the time, Sally was staying at the Rock, with

an old School-friend, and what struck her was how quickly the Riverina community, specifically the Wagga Community gathered together to support one another and the surrounding towns in their crisis. Sally was seeing the best of humanity. Then came COVID-19.

And after all the wonderful community spirit and goodness, she has now become 'distressed by all the distress' she is seeing out in the community. The hoarding of food., the empty supermarket shelves, etc.

Sally states she has spent a lot of time thinking how to report in a way, that does NOT increase the anxiety that is 'out there' in the community. Not reporting the negative, but focusing instead on the positive stories.

For example, the story of a restaurant in Griffith who was getting no dine-in customers, but instead of closing their doors, made up plates of food, to sell to folk who couldn't get out to get food.

Sally wants to help inspire the community to be good to their neighbours, to think of others in their community, their street. Eg whether a neighbour might need help with

their shopping. Help think of ways to entertain folk in their homes, those that are self-isolating, with small children. How can they be entertained? She is encouraging callers to share their ideas and positive thoughts . Sally loves interviewing the various personalities on the ABC. (Maybe some of them will have some good ideas to share).



The evocative words "**We don't just live in an economy, we live in a society**" had all the club members nodding theirs heads as Sally continued to tell us that ABC-Riverina tries to give unbiased, relevant and factual information.

She finished her talk with hopes that as this Covid19 crisis continues that the Australian population can use the opportunity to demonstrate that we are better than this way we have been in recent weeks.

Allan Duffus thanked Sally on behalf of the Club and presented her with a certificate confirming that we will immunise 10 children, somewhere in the world, against Polio, in appreciation of her presentation.

Members voted for a motion that meetings be suspended until 16th April 2020. At a Board meeting following the general meeting, this motion was adopted. 
