Short & Sweet.

Mary Ann Kelly provided our Short and Sweet session this week. She chose to tell us the history behind Easter Eggs and the Easter Bunny.

The custom of Easter Eggs started among the early Christians who took the egg symbolism of new life and fertility, and stained eggs with red colouring in memory of the blood of Christ, shed at His

crucifixion at Easter time. They were sometimes called Resurrection Eggs.

The Easter Bunny (originally a hare), to deliver Easter Eggs, originated in Germany in the early 1700s and was exported to America by German immigrants in the 1800s. From there it has moved right across the Western world and further. Hope you received your delivery!

Fines-Master Session.

Fines Master was PDG Gary Roberts. Armed with a large supply of prizes (chocolate of course), he proceeded to run a trivia night, with members encouraged to pay their 'entry fee' into the fines box.
