MEETING REPORT: -

Laurie Fromholtz.

President David informed the meeting of the sad passing (on Wednesday 31st July) of Laurie Fromholtz, a stalwart member of our Club. The meeting rose for a minute of silence to

remember a great friend, who over many years was an exemplary Rotarian.

Philip Cross then shared the news that on Tuesday 30th July a ceremony was held at Laurie's bedside at which he was awarded a second Sapphire Pin to his Paul Harris Fellowship. Laurie dedicated this to his wife Pat, who was there with family members.

Philip also delivered a heartfelt eulogy, detailing Laurie's lifetime achievements and his involvement in Rotary. This has been summarised in a separate document which accompanies this Bulletin.

Laurie's funeral will take place at Sacred Heart Church, Lake Albert Road Wagga Wagga on Tuesday 6th August at 1.00p.m. Members are encouraged to attend and to wear Rotary attire. Key-Note Speaker.

DG John McKenzie began by 'introducing' Rotary International President Mark Daniel Maloney, who is a lawyer in Alabama specialising in Agricultural Law. He believes that '*Rotary connects the World*' with Rotarians connecting through fellowship and service, thereby changing ourselves and those they assist.

President Maloney has aims for better focused programs with an improved ability to measure impact, expand our reach, crate new channels of appeal and raise awareness of Rotary and its programs.



He also aims to enhance participant engagement by engaging better with members, delivering better values for members by improving conn ections, enhancing Leadership & Development Training; increasing our ability to adapt, research, innovate & take risks. Processes will be streamlined, and Governance improved.

DG McKenzie reminded members of Rotary's Core Values:

- ◊ Integrity
- ♦ Diversity
- ◊ Service
- ♦ Leadership.

District Governor John McKenzie has Strategic Goals to increase our impact and make a difference by expanding our reach regionally and internationally while enhancing participant engagement and adding value to our association in Rotary.

Our ability to adapt will be tested by the merging of District 9710 and 9700 into the new District of 9705 on July 1st 2020. There will be 84 Clubs with 2200 members in the new District. Education centres will be Goulburn and Wagga Wagga.

District 9700 aims include supporting the Rotary Foundation and Polio Plus which has continued its success with only 56 cases reported this Calendar Year mainly in Pakistan where interference with vaccination teams and false propaganda regarding the immunisation programs. Nigeria has celebrated its 3rd year of nil new cases, and in coming months it may be declared 'polio free'.

A Multi District Program being supported is "The Purple House" Organisation which carries out Kidney Dialysis in Remote Areas. There are 16 Remote Clinics and a Mobile Dialysis Bus. This organisation aims to get patients back home so that families and Culture remain strong.



The HQ is in Alice Springs and potential volunteers can receive initial training there prior to assisting at one of the Remote Clinics. In addition Trade Skills are always needed to help in repairs and building of infrastructure.

He concluded by inviting all members to attend the final D9700 Conference in Temora on 20-22 March 2020.

Allan Lean offered the Vote of Thanks and lamented the cancelling of The Group Study Exchange Program but extolled the strength of Rotary acceptance and fellowship around the World.
