#### **MEETING REPORT: -**

#### Attendance.

Past president Peter Veerhuis was in charge in the absence of President David Friedlieb. Opening the meeting, he thanked the Wagga Men's Shed for hosting us for the night and noted that this Men's shed was awarded the title of Men's Shed of the Year in 2017.



### Administration Matters.

The following matters were raised: -

- Vicky Donoghue led a short discussion to clarify the club's involvement with the Gears & Beers Festival to be held on Sunday. We are providing quite a few helpers, and our involvement is part of an agreement with Wollundry Club to provide helpers at our Book Fair set-up and close.
- Allan Duffus expressed his thanks for the help provided by club members when he fell while exiting the recent Movie Night.
- Brad Bland outlined a proposed Youth Exchange arrangement which he and David Cannon are developing, between our club and an Argentinian Rotary club, which will focus on a short term – up to 6 months, which is favoured by many potential participants, and have a bit more flexibility than the formal RI scheme. A local school is prepared to accept an incoming student without fees.
- Details will be set out in an email coming on Monday, and Brad earnestly requests member feedback on the proposal.
- Terry Mecham advised that the club will provide the Barbecue for the Diabetes Foundation fundraising walk around Lake Albert on 20<sup>th</sup> October from 10am. He and Tony may be missing – we will need to finalise arrangements at our next meeting.
- Terry also mentioned that Lilier Lodge dinner nights have been programmed for 4<sup>th</sup> March and 3<sup>rd</sup> June next year.

Acting President Peter introduced Peter Quinane current President of the Men's Shed and told the story of Peter's involvement in recovering our clubs' lost charter document. Sometime in 1951, the original Charter document of our Rotary Club, dated 18th January 1929, was mislaid. Strangely, nobody noticed it had gone missing. Two years later a number of Rotarians, when trying to recall its last sighting, guessed that it seemed to have disappeared some time in 1951. The Club then organised a replacement Charter from Rotary International in 1953.

Imagine the incredible joy, when in February 1995 the original Charter was found! 44 years after it went missing!

The gentleman who bought a dusty piece of paper in a decorative wooden frame for \$5.00 at the Estate sale at the home of the late Mr Ray Thornton in Murray Street, Wagga Wagga in February 1995 was none other than Peter Quinane. The late Mr Thornton had lived at the address for 40 years. Following some enquiries it became clear that the Charter belonged to our Club and arrangements were made to return it to the rightful owners. The rest is History.

Declining the offer of \$5 recompense, Peter confirmed our welcome to the Men's Shed and touched on a few of their recent projects, including sprucing up tables, chairs, and bin holders along the Main Street in association with the City Council, upgrading work at Downside Hall, as well as a new shed on their site. He thanked their catering corps for a great job on the night.

Men's Shed founder Rick Priest presented our member Graeme Callander with a token of their esteem for Graeme's involvement some years ago with the Shed's insurance, which stood them in good stead when the premises were torched – a giant Anzac biscuit, made by their member John Mason.

President Peter handed over \$725-00 covering the night's catering.

Mike Murray moved the vote of thanks to the Men's Shed for their great hospitality, and for the wonderful dinner provided.
