Our Guest Speaker John Egan, was joined by his wife Maria. President Alan acknowledged all club members wearing hats/headgear in honour of Rotary Mental Health.



Club Business

- President Alan opened the meeting with the sad news of the passing of John Chambers from Chambers Whyte printing. John had been a Rotary Club of South Wagga member.
- > Terry Meacham informed the club that the BBQ Team have two events coming up:
 - The Clontarf students from Mount Austin have their Awards night on Wednesday 1st December 2021 from 6pm till 7pm. As usual, the BBQ Team will be cooking up a storm for the students and their parents.
 - Then on Friday 3rd December 2021 (which happens to coincide with Terry and Fran's wedding anniversary) at lunchtime the BBQ Team will provide their services for the Disability/Mental Health Services. **Both events will be at the Botanic Gardens Music Bowl.**
- Vida acknowledged Paul and Judy Galloway's generosity in donating a (nearly) brand new Ping Pong Table, complete with new bats, to the Clontarf Boys, as our clubs gift to them this year. It had been noted by members during the Friday breakfasts that their Ping Pong table was looking well used and a little passed its prime. (like many of us!). Short & Sweet.

Elaine Almond reminded the club that 24th October 2021 was World Polio Day, and our meeting that week was held via Zoom, due to the Lockdown restrictions, so this is her first opportunity to mark the occasion. (We then had a brief pause in Elaine's presentation whilst Gerry Page attempted to 'sneak up on her' and take a photo). Once Elaine was no longer distracted, she continued to point out the 'END POLIO NOW' banner which was up at the front of the room. Elaine then went on to inform us that in 2020, Afghanistan had 56 cases and Pakistan had 86 cases of Polio. In 2021, both countries have recorded only 1 case of Polio, which is fantastic, and we can only hope that with the present geopolitical situation in those countries, that next year the numbers remain as low, or even less!



Elaine then went on to talk about the Rotary Banner and for those who did not know, the clubs are listed alphabetically in our new district 9705. Elaine wanted to point out to us all that the dates all the clubs were all chartered are also listed, and accordingly, our club shares second place with a Goulburn Club that was also Chartered in 1930.

Fines-Master

David Wynne entertained everyone with a VERY complex story of family dynamics and used it to suggest that anyone in the club who had ANY relations such as Mother/Father/ Brother/ Sister/ Husband/Wife, they should 'Kick the Tin'. (One assumes not literally)



The story was all about a man marrying a widow, and then his father marrying the widow's grown up daughter. Once the man and the widow had a baby, the complexities of the familial relationships were enough to permanently cross ones eyes. (As David said, he had to read through the story 5 times to check every fact was correct.) Naturally, everyone in the club had to pay a fine. David then finished his fine session listing all the local businesses that have struggled during Covid. To name a few; Interflora had to prune it's business model, a food blender company that went into liquidation and a local bra manufacturer that has gone bust. You might be able to guess how this was used to fine those listening.

AUCTION:

David Wynne and Brad Bland then successfully auctioned off donated items from various members. All items were graciously received, but there were a couple of noteworthy bids. Bronwyn Callander had donated two beautiful teddy bears that she had made, and one of them fetched \$130, bought by Lyndal Seymour. The other items donated by President Alan were sketches of three Prime Ministers done live by Larry Pickering at a Fund Raising event for the First Camp Quality back in 1986. Gordon Saggers was the successful bidder for these wonderful items. In total \$1025.00 was raised for Australian Rotary Health/ Mental Health Research by auctioning all the donated items. A huge thank you to all concerned.





Guest Speaker

Tony Hutchinson introduced tonight's Guest Speaker, past District Governor John Egan, who is the Australian Rotary Health Co-ordinator for District 9705.

John commenced his presentation by thanking our club members for their on-going support of Australian Rotary Health, which he stated is the most important non-government organisation for donating funds to Australian medical situations.

John said that 'Mental Health' is a buzz word' now, whereas as little as 15



years ago, there was a huge stigma associated with having mental health problems. He stated at that time Australian Rotary Health had a lot to do with changing public perception of mental health, he thinks in large part due to his good friend Noel Trevaskis who was the Chairman of Australian Rotary Health.

Noel was a driving force of that change and himself suffered from mental health issues, so used that insight in his work to bring about those changes. Australian Rotary Health is now one of the biggest sources of income for research into mental health.

John then went on to explain that currently Australian Rotary Health is moving into research of young children from 0-12 yrs, using Professor Michael Sawyers findings that children that suffered a major 'episode' between the age of 0-12yrs are at a high risk of developing into an adult with serious mental health issues, if that 'episode' was not treated well at the time it occurred. Australian Rotary Health run a program called 'Triple P' which is a 'Positive Parenting Program' which helps parents by giving them tools to help raise happy and confident children.

Two in every ten children experience anxiety during early childhood, and another world-renowned Rotary program called 'Cool Kids' is a self-help program designed to help these children. The statistics John gave us were quite disturbing in that 14% of Australian children experience mental disorders, and 50% of mental

disorders across all age groups have their onset by the age of 14yrs. This reiterates the importance of the work being done for children between the ages of 0-12yrs. John finished his presentation telling our club members that the money raised tonight will all go into the mental health research areas, as well as the other areas of Rotary Health such as Indigenous Health Scholarships, Rural Nursing Scholarships, etc

FILM NIGHT


