MEETING REPORT: -

President Alan invited all present at our temporary Rules Club venue, given the unavailability of the Country Club at short notice, to stand for the Invocation, a toast to Rotary International and International Women's Day.

He then welcomed 33 members, **especially Terry Mecham returning from a bout of serious illness**, Guest Speaker Des Goonan; as well as Dr Abed, Renas Khalef, and Shane Carroll, (guest of Marg Everett.) He thanked the Rules Club for providing a room for our meeting at no charge..

Short & Sweet:-

Gerry Page reminded us what an amazing world we live in, using as a prop a frying pan lid battered by atmospheric pressure in a kitchen incident. He told us that that humans have got one tonne of air pressing down on them, same as the weight of a small car and explained why it doesn't crush us like the lid.

The recent flooding suggested to him another aspect of the atmosphere, eg how much does a cloud weigh? He noted that no one is afraid to walk underneath a cumulus cloud because they are afraid it might fall on them, but blooming heck, when their contents rain down on us they weigh many tonnes. Sydney had more than 300 mm of rain so far in March - over every square Km, that translates to 300 million litres of water which is 300 million kilograms or 300 thousand tonnes, that originally floated over their heads. Multiply that out for the coastal area involved it and he reckoned you'd agree it becomes absolutely amazing.

Fines-Master:-

Fines Master was Gordon Saggers who asked for a sympathy fine for EI Presidente Alan who donged his head during the week. Gordon didn't have much trouble getting other fines paid with some great targeted humour: why would dogs be named Rolex and Timex – they're watch dogs of course; guy stopped for speeding asked to show his licence complaining "You cops should get your act together, just yesterday you took my licence off me and now you expect me to show it to you. Another guy consulting a mechanic complaining his engine died, was told "Just crap in the carburettor'. "How often do I need to do that" he enquired. Good fun Gordon and profitable.



Key-Note Speaker

Guest speaker for the evening, Des Goonan, was introduced by David Cannon, taken a bit by surprise by a change in scheduling. Des is obviously a hugely experienced fisherman and gave a great expose of many aspects of that art. He mentioned his early fishing experiences - the lack of fishing at home Dubbo, necessitating trips to the Barwon River seeking murray cod. A key experience involved an irrigation dam 2 kilometres long and 10metres deep at the wall. Ducks were a problem and the dam was stocked with fish (cod) in 1990, by 1992 cod were about 50cm long, and they fixed the duck problem by eating



chicks. Des told us that cod, in fact, eat everything observed floating in the water, including the young of European Carp, whose numbers are falling.

He indicated that the Lachlan River has heaps of cod. Blowering Dam is an excellent cod hatchery, though water releases interfere. River cod are harder to catch than in dams - river cod are fitter because of the currents and it is harder to "wear them out" than in a dam. His favourite cod bait is cheese, the secret being the scent in the water. Funds from licences go towards restocking – fishing clubs match this. The scheme is very successful and has improved fishing.



Des was thanked for a fascinating talk behind the scenes of fishing by Graham Russell.
