President Alan started with the Invocation, a toast to Rotary International and to our Club. He then welcomed 30 members and guest Renas Khalef who is soon to join us as a member.

President Alan's Club Information and Director Reports:

- Alan asked PDG Gary Roberts to give us some news after Dr Luc's visit from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Gary advised that our Club has approved the purchase and forwarding of two of Howard Mendel's water filtration units, as well as a class room of furniture from Tolland Primary School to DR of Congo. He is seeking some assistance to deliver the furniture from Tolland PS to Ron Crouch Transport's depot, for trucking to Adelaide where it will be loaded into a container to be shipped to DR of Congo.
- Alan also asked for support from our members to help out at the 9.45 **Anzac Day ceremony** in front of the Council Chambers. Duties will include handing out flags at 9.45am and brochures at 10.30am. BOOK BOOK BOOK FAIR.

- IT'S VERY EXCITING! Our major fund raiser, the Book Fair is very close 14th-15th May.
- Last year, some members were able to arrange sponsorships from local firms to support our promotional expenses etc. Would those people contact David Wynn ASAP to confirm whether those arrangements might continue in 2022, so the donors can be acknowledged in our feature in the Daily Advertiser.



- Program of activity leading up to the Fair is as follows:
 - Club meeting program on 5th May will be a planning session for Book Fair arrangements..
 - A few volunteers will be needed in any early set-up jobs eg: erection of signage around town, transport of flat boxes, hall signs etc. Able to be involved? Let Graham Russell know.
 - Wednesday morning 11th May from 9am set up tables at the Hall with assistance of Clontarf boys. A team of members will be needed also to construct boxes, so that they are ready around tables for decanting stock.
 - Uplift will be from 2.30pm Thursday 12th May and a few members will be needed to assist
 with loading. Then all hands on deck at the Hall for unloading, from around 3.30pm.
 - Friday 13th from 10am enhance stock display, erect hall signage etc.
 - Saturday morning 14th May from 8am doors open for sale. The same entry / exit arrangements as last year will apply. Roster sheets will be out at April 28th & 5th May meetings.

Short & Sweet:-.

Vicky Donohue gave us an interesting biological presentation about blood, that important fluid tissue in the body. She told us that the average adult has around 5 litres of blood. A woman generally has less blood than a man, except when she is pregnant, during which time her blood volume will increase by around 50%.

Vicky explained the role of blood cells and gave some amazing figures on the numbers of cells, their travel throughout the body and their reproduction via the bone marrow. The blood travels in a system of arteries, capillaries and



veins. We learned that if you were to lay out all of these vessels found in one adult they would stretch about 100,000 kilometres – so a single person's blood vessels could wrap around the planet approximately 2.5 times! Getting the blood through this intricate roadmap to service every cell of the body is the job of the heart. The average heart beats 70 times per minute, 100,000 times per day......that's well over 2 billion times during the life of a 75-year-old.

Vicky likened our body to our car. When you get it, it's beautiful on the outside but as the years pass, no matter what you do, people see it for what it is.... an aging model. But don't worry, it might look a bit ordinary on the outside, but as long as it is still humming along under the bonnet, it will pass rego and keep on running! Amazing!

Finesmaster:-.



Fines Master Don Pembleton started with a fine for raffle winner Elaine Almond, got Phil Cross for supposedly getting a "mixed message" from his Doctor and then worked a few fines around some significant events which historically occurred on this day of the year, including:

- Principality of Hutt River secedes from Australia (1970)
- The Red Baron shot down and killed over the Somme (1918)
- Queen Elizabeth II born (1928)
- Elvis's first hit record "Heartbreak Hotel" becomes #1 (1956)
- Protest underway in Beijing's Tiananmen Square (1989)

He concluded with his thought for the day - "A clear conscience is often the sign of a fuzzy memory."

Rotary Information Session:-.

Guest speaker was none other than our President Alan, who gave us his Session 2 of Rotary Information. He gave us a brief history of Rotary, with its first meeting of four people in 1905, organised by Chicago attorney Paul Harris. The proposal was that professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships.

Alan followed this by an indication of Rotary's spread and strength to 34000 Clubs and 1.4 million members in 150 countries today.



He spoke about the 4-Way Test and the 6 Areas of Focus. He also discussed the allied organisations of Rotaract and Interact. Alan also detailed the worldwide organisation of Rotary and how our Club fits into that. He emphasised that Rotary has a bottoms up structure whereby all the Clubs are independent. The District and International Boards are there to serve the Clubs.

Our Club was Chartered in 1930 and is in Area 3 of District 9705, which was recently formed following the merger of Districts 9700 and 9710. Area 3 includes 13 Clubs and the Governor of Area 3 in D9705 is our member Elaine Almond. In Australia there are 21 Districts. We are also in Zone 8 of Rotary International, which covers Australia. New Zealand and the South Pacific.

Alan concluded that Rotary is the largest and most successful Not-For-Profit organisation in the world. There is a wealth of detail on Rotary activities on the internet. Thanks Alan


