We were all saddened to learn that **Pat Fromholtz**, wife of our late great member Laurie Fromholtz, has passed away. Pat was involved in supporting Laurie within our club in many ways: as secretarial support in his years with the club bulletin and his associated literary pursuits, but particularly as a driving force behind the Art Show which our club ran for some years, (inherited from Pat's Quota Club in which she had also been very active.). Pat ran the artistic liaison and competition aspects of the event, involving liaison with artists from a vast database; sourcing, recording and returning entries, arranging judges and much more.. Pat was presented with a Paul



Harris Fellow award by the club in 2005 in recognition of her efforts and a Sapphire Pin in 2019, presented to her by Laurie while he was hospitalised, seriously ill.

• Graham Russell addressed the meeting to give a short session on Book Fair preparations. He displayed a range of Book Fair publicity material, he asked members to use promoting the event: including two sizes of posters to be displayed on shop windows, notice boards etc; a smaller variety suitable for car windows, and small flyers to distribute to friends, coffee spots, work areas etc...



- A small team of volunteers was found to assist Peter Olson to erect our street signage this week.
- Roster nomination sheets were passed around tables and will be there again next week.
- Program of activity leading up to the Fair is as follows:
 - Club meeting program on 5th May will be a planning session for Book Fair arrangements...

 with loading. Then all hands on deck at the Hall for unloading, from around 3.30pm.

Short & Sweet:-.

Our Member **Shishir Bhengra** told us he had migrated from Patna (population 2.35 million), and the 19th largest city in India.. It was also the City which first introduced him to Rotary! Shishir told us that Patna was founded in 490 BCE by the King of Magadha! Pataliputra was a seat of learning and fine arts. It was home to many astronomers and scholars including Aryabhata, Vatsyayana and Chanakya. The City of Patna served as the seat of power, and



political and cultural centre of the Indian sub-continent during the Maurya and Gupta empires.

With the fall of the Gupta Empire, Patna lost its glory. It was revived again in the 17th Century by the British as a centre of international trade. Shishir was born and brought up in Patna. He then moved to Delhi for higher studies and work. He then moved to Australia.

David Friedlieb drew his own raffle ticket and was immediately rewarded with a fine bottle of red! He then proceeded to fine all and sundry for our minor misdemeanors – for example:- who knows what the focus of April 2022 Rotary International is? Answer:- Maternal and Child Health Month. Our guest speaker Renas supplied the answer to the question regarding the five countries which border Iraq. Yes, the answer is Turkey!



Guest Speaker

David Wynne introduced our Guest Speaker Renas Bari, who attended our meeting with his father Khalaf and his sister Midiya. Using highly effective overheads, Renas was able to convey the pain and suffering and terrorism experienced by the ordinary people in the Yazidi population of Iraq, persecuted for their religious beliefs by the extreme ISIS group. Over 5,200 Yazidi refugees were allowed to come to Australia. Renas and his family first settled in Armidale, however later found that they had greater prospects of employment opportunities in a larger centre like Wagga. Renas, who



turned 21 on 14th of April this year, has completed study at TAFE, and now is pursuing Business Management at university level. A major objective of the family is to arrange visas for his grandparents, still in a camp over there, so that they can be reunited. Allan Duffus moved the Vote of Thanks on behalf of our members.
