The Rotary Foundation.

In 2016-17, our Rotary Foundation turned 100. That's a century of Rotary members changing lives and improving communities all over the world.

The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into projects that change lives throughout the world. It is the charitable arm of Rotary International which facilitates local Clubs/Rotarians tapping into the global network which invests time, money, and expertise into Rotary's 'Areas of Focus'.



Foundation Grants empower Rotarians to approach challenges that may otherwise be beyond their capabilities. The most successful and sustainable projects normally fall into the following areas: -

- Promoting Peace
- Fighting Disease
- Providing Clean Water
- Saving Mothers & Children
- Supporting Education
- Growing Local Economies

History of the Rotary Foundation.

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary International President, Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world." In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International. In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation.

Evolution of Foundation programs.

1947: The Foundation established its first program, Fellowships for Advance Study, later known as Ambassadorial Scholarships.

1978: Rotary introduced the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants. The first 3-H Grant funded a project to immunize 6 million Philippine children against polio.

1985: The Polio-Plus Programme was launched to eradicate polio worldwide.

1987-88: The first peace forums were held, leading to Rotary Peace Fellowships.

Since the first donation of \$26.50 in 1917, the Foundation has received contributions totalling more than one billion US dollars.
