David Friedlieb continued his series of word pictures, describing notable characters that he had encountered in his career as a CPA in Wagga Wagga. Obviously, the names have been omitted (to protect the innocent??).

This chapter described an older widow, with no dependents, who had very set ideas on how her estate should be distributed. Despite the financial and legal advice received she seemed reluctant to disclose her complete financial situation and to execute an up-dated will – which had been drafted, but never signed. Several appointments were made with her (Sydney based) solicitor but she never kept them. Unfortunately, she passed away before she signed the new will.

David was aware of her intention as stated in the unsigned will, as was her solicitor and executor (a cousin), but without a legally binding will there was considerable difficulty in obtaining probate and processing her intentions. There were similarities between the two documents in that they nominated the same beneficiaries – but the amounts and proportions differed. Eventually through extensive negotiation, agreement was reached between the beneficiaries and the matter settled. Her estate was valued at close to ten million dollars, a sizable donation even by today's values.

Possibly there is a message for all of us in this story – be prepared 'for you know not the hour....'

Another notable character encountered as a result of this particular exercise was Rev Bill Crews who has a high public profile, working with under-privileged persons in the inner western suburbs of Sydney – but that story might be for another session.

As the evening progressed, we were again entertained by the amusive Gerry Page who centred his fines-session on occurrences at the recent Book Fair. The session was accompanied by the regular tinkle of coins dropping into the fine boxes.


The usual suspects (raffle winner Terry Mecham, and those with birthdays and anniversaries) also 'contributed to the cause'.


Our Club Treasurer, Nepal presented a detailed report of the gross takings – and fully endorsed the sentiment that this one was 'the best yet'.
