

David Wynne entertained members with a short history of the "Dunny". He reminded us that many Australians refer to going to the toilet as 'going to the dunny', 'going to the John', 'going to the outhouse' etc.

A dunny is essentially a toilet out the back of a house or public building. Thanks to Paul Hogan the outback toilet gained a reputation of being identifiably Australian. Dunnies come in all shapes and sizes and are now

considered part of our Australian Heritage.

Toilet paper was referred to as 'dunny paper' and often consisted of newspaper cut into squares of appropriate size.

Blowflies were referred to as 'Dunny Budgies' because of their large size and sound.

The man who collected the sanitary cans was referred to as the 'Dunnyman' and the lanes behind the houses as 'dunnylanes'.

The word dunny is not used much now but it has entered our vocabulary. Here are two examples of this:- "all alone like country dunny" meaning very lonely or isolated, and "carry the can" meaning to do the dirty work.

Peter Smart introduced Tobias (Toby) Krebs. Peter met Toby at his



Wednesday Drawing class and invited him along to share what he does with us.

Toby was born and raised in Wagga and graduated with a Bachelor of Creative Arts in Animation and Visual Effects from Charles Sturt University

(Wagga) in 2017. (Sadly, this course has now been discontinued.) He has had a lifelong obsession with cartooning and has been able to fulfil this passion by working on some well-known animation projects. He is currently working as a storyboard artist

on episodes of the *Spongebob Squarepants* cartoon for Nickelodeon. He started this work at the height of the pandemic and creates his work here in Wagga even though Nickelodeon is based in Los Angeles and New York. Other credits in his portfolio include animating an upcoming HBO Max series – '*Jellystone*', and 2D Animation on a hand drawn *Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles* Arcade Game. He has also worked on animated movies such as *Boss Baby* and *Archibald's Next Big Adventure*. His work is intricate, detailed and very exacting. He



creates all the main 'poses' of the animated characters in a production. Meeting deadlines is important, as a very large team of animation studio workers awaits his work in order to finalise the animation.... It can take 16 pictures to create one second of animation!

In his 'down time', Tobias created a short animated film 'Breakfast in Bed', which has been widely acclaimed, and has another in production. (If you are interested to see his creation, visit <u>https://tobiaskrebsanimation.com/films</u>.)



Members were fascinated by the whole process of creating animations, and were amazed that this high-level work for internationally known entities is able to be carried out here in Wagga. Bruce Barber thanked Toby for his presentation and somewhere in the world, ten children will benefit from his visit by being immunised against Polio.
