Thirty-one Members were present plus one guest, Andrew Stow, who was both a visiting Rotarian (Rotary Club of Corrimal) and our Key-Note Speaker.

Administration Matters.

- There was a Board meeting held last week. Points of interest included: -
 - → That following **Club Distributions** for assistance at the Book Fair, Clontarf have requested that their donation be used to purchase a 'ping-pong' table. We are also waiting to hear from the Kooringal High School Principal and students on what they would like us to do with their donation.
 - → Presidents from all the Wagga Rotary Clubs met and had a positive and constructive discussion on 'What We Can Do Together'.
 - → The **Timor Leste Clean Water Project** is progressing with advice that Engineers Without Borders has become involved as has T-L Rotaract. It is hoped that 5-10 filtration units can be installed in the next 6 months.

 - → An amount of \$5,000-\$5,500 has been allocated to our **Darkness-to-Light Project** to allow some seventy (plus) cataract operations to be carried out in India.

Key-Note Speaker.

Our Guest Speaker was regular visiting Rotarian, Andrew Stow. Andrew told us about his lifelong interest in things maritime which led him to join the volunteer team that sail the Tall Ship 'James Craig'. The ship was built in Sunderland, England in 1874.

The 'James Craig' has sailed the equivalent of 29 times around the world. Andrew spent six years as part of the crew, qualifying as a rigger (with his aloft ticket) and spending many hours clambering up masts, furling and unfurling the sails. He described how the ship usually accompanies the Sydney to Hobart Race yachts out of Sydney Harbour, stopping and getting in their way off Bondi then returning back to the Harbour while the yachts continued to Hobart. He also did trips from Sydney to Hobart for the Australian Wooden Boats Festival (even though she has a wrought iron hull) which is held every second year. He told us the worst hazards at sea, besides the





The ship usually has a crew of 30 sailors of which 16-17 spend much of their time in the rigging. Her top speed is around 12 knots. It cost almost \$AU30m to restore her over 40 years after she was recovered from Recherche Bay in southern Tasmania in 1972. She had been abandoned there in 1932. It takes around \$1m per annum to maintain her. She receives no government funding, relying on visitors, paying passengers and a very supportive relationship with the Albert family (from the music industry) to keep her going.

It was a very enjoyable presentation with lots of photos, followed by many questions. Thanks Andrew.

The meeting concluded at 7.46 PM much to Bruce Heydon's delight.
