Our visitors included ex-member, Elle Palmer, Cat Daley (guest of Elaine Almond) and visiting Rotarian Andrew Stowe (Rotary Club of Corrimal)

Administration Matters.

- ➔ It was with sadness that President Alan informed the meeting that Merryl Cross passed away a few days ago. Funeral arrangements are not yet finalised and should be published in the local newspaper (probably Saturday's edition). President Alan requested that members attend the funeral and form a guard of honor at the conclusion.
- → Elaine reported, with a degree of sadness, that the Rotary Club of Murrumbidgee will be handing in their charter and the remaining members transferring to the Brindabella 'E' Club.
- → DG Leo Farrelly has been awarded an OAM.
- → Vida reminded all that acceptances for the Clontarf Academy presentation night (1st December) need to be advised to her (Mob: 0412 805 463) by Tuesday at the latest.
- → Tony recapped up-coming BBQ duties: -

- ➔ President Alan briefly discussed the recently released Rotary Council of Resolutions. The report was tabled for those interested to review in detail.
- → Andrew Stowe who has been a regular visiting Rotarian over the past months announced that his role in Wagga Wagga in coming to an end and he will be returning to his home Club (Corrimal). We all wished him well.

Short & Sweet.

Bryan Short provided an update on the global acceptance of Electric Vehicles (EVs) which are predicted to eventually become 'the norm' in Australia.

Currently the main deterrent is the purchase price; an EV costs around 30% more than comparative conventional vehicles. The running costs are substantially less however this is believed to be unsustainable unless the owner has access to solar recharging. On current costings, the power cost to run an EV is estimated to be around half that of a comparable petrol/diesel powered vehicle.



The global leaders in converting to EVs appear to be the Scandinavian

countries, led by Norway where substantial Government incentives are provided. It is estimated that by 2025 the only new vehicles available for purchase in that country will be EVs. There are very limited (if any) incentives from Australian governments.

Bryan explored possible future scenarios stretching out to 2050 and beyond. He provided much food-forthought but concluded that the internal combustion engine, in Australia, will probably out live all present.

Fines-Master Session.

Gordon Saggers opened his Fines Session by levying a fine against President Alan who seemed to influence Cat Daley (Elaine's guest) to draw his name from the barrel.

Other notable fines included: -

NOVEMBER IS ROTARY FOUNDATION MONTH: -




Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a Rotary Foundation project where young adults develop leadership skills while having fun and making connections. It is an intensive leadership experience supported by our Rotary District.

RYLA connects potential leaders in our community and around the world to: -

- Build communication and problem-solving skills
- Discover strategies for becoming a dynamic leader in a school or community
- Learn from community leaders, inspirational speakers & peer mentors
- Unlock potential to turn motivation into action
- Have fun and form lasting friendships

RYLA events are organised locally by Rotary Clubs and Districts for participants ages 14-30 years. Depending on community needs, RYLA may take the form of a one-day seminar, a three-day retreat, or a week-long camp. Typically, events last 3-10 days and include presentations, activities, and workshops covering a variety of topics.

Our District hosts RYLA events for secondary school students to hone their leadership potential, for university students to develop creative problem-solving strategies, or for young professionals to learn ethical business practices.
